3. Terms and conditions of membership including rates of subscription, method and timing of payments are subject to change in accordance with the conditions, rules and constitution of the Club.

Upper Thames is a registered CASC "Community Amateur Sports Club". CASC Registration Number: CASC 04325

4. All subscriptions fall on 1st September the beginning of the Club's rowing season and are payable on demand. Please pay on time and ensure anyone you row with is a paid up member or the Club's insurance for boats, equipment and third parties may be invalidated.
5. Applications for membership where the use of the Club facilities commences during the rowing year shall be reduced proportionally from the full fee after 31st December. The reduction will date from the time Club facilities are first used not from the date subs are paid.
6. Junior members shall be rowing members restricted to those members who are under the age of 18 years at the time of the confirmation of their application or Re-application.
7. To qualify for the discounted rate for members over 65, you must be able to demonstrate to the Committee that you have been a member of the Club for over 10 years and be able to satisfy the age criteria.
8. Widows (or widowers) of members who have been members for at least 10 years prior to death, may become honorary members, with all the benefits of associate membership, on application.
9. Associate members are considered non-rowing members and as such may not use Club equipment, boating facilities or vote on rowing matters at the AGM. Associate members are not entitled to rack a boat.
10. On paying your subscription you are rejoining the Club for another year. By doing so you will be acknowledging that information provided by you will be retained on a computer. This information will be used for the purposes of the Club's administration including the disclosure of names and addresses to other Club members, publishing lists of Club members, telephone numbers and addresses on the Club's notice boards and the Club's website. The Club will increasingly communicate with members by email and therefore references made in the Constitution on publication or dissemination of information can at the discretion of the Committee be made only by email. Membership constitutes your irrevocable agreement that the Club is within the terms of the Data Protection Act and any related legislation in so far as the information held about you by the Club is concerned. You are welcome to ask the committee at any time for a copy of your personal information held by the Club.
11. It is the responsibility of members with private boats kept at the Club to ensure they are properly insured and have an Environment Agency licence. The Club insurance does not provide ANY cover for private boats whilst on Club premises, on the river or during transport to and from events. The Club takes no responsibility for any damage to privately owned boats.
12. If you have a boat stored anywhere on the Club's premises you must pay a racking fee – this applies to junior and to full members alike. There is a big queue for racks. If you have a rack and it is not paid for by 30th September 2009 it will be subject to reallocation without further reference and the committee reserves the right to sell your boat if it remains on Club premises beyond this date. The only exception will be if the committee waives this requirement **in writing** before this date.
13. Non-rowing water vessels should not be stored on the Club premises without the prior permission of the Captain. If permission is granted the cost of storage will be the same as the rack fee.
14. Members are obliged to display an identifying number on private boats. These will be allocated to you. If you do not comply with affixing it UTRC will affix it for you and will not be held liable for any damage which may occur as a result of doing so.
15. The Captain; Justin Sutherland; and the Membership Secretary; Rebecca Sadler; are responsible for allocating racks. If you have any issues with racking please speak to them directly.



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TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR NEW MEMBERS:

16. Only Club members may use Club equipment or the Club's facilities, unless a member has written permission from the committee stating otherwise. Any damage or third party liability incurred by the guest of a member will be the responsibility of that member.
17. If you are representing UTRC or have entered a head or regatta or any other event as UTRC you must wear Club kit and all members of the boat must be fully paid up members of the Club. All members must represent UTRC when racing. In composite boats Club members must wear Club kit.
18. All members who intend to row at the Club are required to be ARA registered. The UTRC website contains a link to the ARA website for those who need to become ARA members.
19. All members who intend to row from the Club must be able to swim 100m in light clothing.
20. No individual will be able to race for the Club unless his/her subs have been paid in full ahead of the event.
21. If you are racing at a regatta, a head or any other event, you will be expected to pay the whole cost of entrance fees, boat transport and any other costs generally in advance of any entry being submitted.
22. Members must report any damage to boats, equipment and facilities. Members may be liable for the first fifty pounds of any repair incurred and may be liable for other costs if the rowing committee deems that member negligent.
23. If you row or scull after dark in private or Club equipment you must display the correct boat lights. These are a single fixed white light on the bow and a single fixed white light on the stern. Failure to do so may result in suspension from membership by the Committee.
24. The Club operates a procedure that allows Club members to raise complaints about issues. Complaints concerning Club safety or operational matters should initially be address to the Captain. If this does not prove satisfactory a written complaint should be made to the main Committee. The matter will be considered at the next available Committee Meeting
25. If you are experiencing difficulties in paying your membership or racking due to your financial circumstances please speak directly to the Membership Secretary.

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
